

PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

RIVER OAKS PARK RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

RIVER OAKS ESTATES SUBDIVISION



The River Oaks Park in the River Oaks Estates Subdivision is the next park to be updated in our multi-year Park Replacement Program. Built in 1999, the neighborhood park is located at the southwest corner of Ranchwood and Colonade. The new park will include new playground equipment and surface, site furniture, signage, educational landscaping, and an updated ½-court basketball surface.

Design will be completed over the winter season with construction anticipated to begin late Summer 2024 and completion by Fall 2024.

RIVER'S EDGE PARK

BETWEEN RIVER CROSSING & LAKE OF THE WOODS SUBDIVISIONS



The Village purchased a 36-acre vacant parcel using grant funds awarded to the Village by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) in 2021. The clearing and mass grading of the property was completed in 2023.

We are currently in design to construct Phase A of the multiyear multi-phase park project. Phase A will include river access, a playground, shelter, parking lot, volleyball courts, and a portion of the trail system. The total cost for this phase is estimated to be near \$1.2 million where the Village was fortunate to be awarded a \$600,000 grant from Open-Space Lands Acquisition and Development (OSLAD).

Design will be completed over the winter season with construction anticipated to begin early Summer 2024 with completion by Fall 2024.

A MESSAGE FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT



The Spring and Summer months are rapidly approaching and with this comes the time for people to emerge from their winter activities and spend time outdoors. This includes children who will be more likely to enjoy outdoor activities. Motorists need to be aware that school is still in session. Also, the likelihood of children playing or riding bicycles outside when the weather improves is higher and so is the risk of tragedy. Drivers are asked to be more aware of their surroundings and obey all speed limits and traffic laws, particularly when traveling through neighborhoods or near schools.

Mid-March is not only a time to be aware of winter weather and potentially hazardous driving conditions, but it is also the time when revelers will be celebrating the St. Patrick's Day holiday. This is a particularly dangerous night and weekend for impaired and distracted driving. This year, the holiday is on a Friday which may lead to further risk of bad judgment on the part of motorists who have been drinking. Please, use rideshare apps, designate a sober driver, and recognize the signs when a friend has had too much to drink.

This season is also a good time to remind drivers not to be distracted or use their cell phones while driving. The State of Illinois and the Illinois Department of Transportation have designated April as Distracted Driving Month. This is a time of year when these groups partner with local law enforcement to make the public aware of the dangers of distracted driving. The Shorewood Police will be conducting increased education and visible enforcement during this time to aid in preventing this behavior.

The Shorewood Police Department has another new face this year. The Department welcomed a new member, Daisy DeLira. Officer DeLira came

to us after serving seven years in the United States Army. Once she is done with her field training, she will be assigned to the Patrol Division.



BUILDING DEPARTMENT REMINDERS

Code Enforcement is responsible for enforcing building codes, zoning codes and other municipal ordinances adopted for the safety, health and well-being of the public. Enforcement Inspectors are part of a problem-solving team that informs property owners of violations and uses their knowledge and experience to help find solutions to compliance issues. The goal of the Code Enforcement Department is to build relationships with the community to support safe and healthy living and working conditions. Enforcement Inspectors patrol residential and commercial zones, follow-up on concerns from residents, homeowner associations and area businesses and identify code compliance issues to provide a positive impact on the property values and image of our community.



TOP 10 WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

Ways To Incorporate Water Conservation In Your Home

- 1. Purchase and install WaterSense labeled toilets.
- Don't let the water run when brushing your teeth, washing your face or shaving. Most of it will be wasted. Just take what you need and save the rest.
- 3. Control your irrigation.
 - Ensure the direction of water is maximized as well as adding auto features for on and off.
- 4. When loading your dishwasher or washing machine, make sure that you are filling them up. Running a cycle through one larger load saves more water than running multiple, smaller loads.
- 5. If everyone in the U.S. flushed the toilet just one less time per day, we could save a lake full of water about a mile long, a mile wide, and four feet deep..... Every day!
- Check for leaks. A faucet drip of only two tablespoons a minute is equal to 105 gallons of water in a week.
- 7. Do your lawn sprinkling early in the morning, between 6:00 am -9:00 am. After 10:00 am, both heat and evaporation increase, robbing the lawn of moisture.
- 8. Purchase a cover for your pool or hot tub. Making sure your pool or hot tub is covered when not in use can help reduce evaporation.
- 9. Landscape for water conservation.
 - Try the concept of Xeriscape which means "landscape for water conservation."
- 10. Be Smart. Example: When cleaning your fish tank, use the dirty water to water your house plants. The water is rich in nitrogen and phosphorous.

OUTDOOR WATERING RESTRICTIONS

Water conservation is something everyone should practice. Except for the air we breathe, water is the single most important element in our lives. It's too precious to waste.

In an effort to conserve water for fire protection, health and environmental reasons, the Village of Shorewood asks for your cooperation in complying with the following regulations:

DAYS: Addresses ending in even numbers may water on even number calendar days. Addresses ending in odd numbers may water on odd number calendar days. This applies year round including weekend and holidays.


HOURS: 6:00 am to 10:00 am & 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm

NEWELY SODDED AND SEEDED LAWNS: Permits for newly sodded or seeded yards can be obtained to allow for watering outside of the odd/even permitted days. No permits will be issued between June 15th and September 15th.

SEWER DUMPING

Please help keep water clean by refraining from dumping anything down sewer grates. The sewer grates drain directly into rivers, streams and ponds.

YARD WASTE DISPOSAL

Waste Management will resume yard waste collection with the weekly scheduled pick-up on Tuesday, April 2nd. The last day for pick-up is Tuesday, December 10th.

Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, tree branches, and brush. Grass clippings and leaves must be placed in Kraft paper bags or an acceptable yard waste container from Waste Management.

Brush and branches must be cut into 4ft. lengths and bundled with string or twine. Each bundle must not exceed 50 lbs. Limbs cannot exceed 4 inches in circumference. Unbundled brush will not be collected.

Residents can rent or purchase a 96-gallon yard waste cart from Waste Management. Please call Waste Management for more information or if you have any questions, (800) 964-8988

DOES YOUR HOME HAVE AN IRRIGATION SYSTEM?

Did you know that you are required to get an RPZ [Backflow Assembly] test annually whether you use it or not?

Studies have found that the most common cross-connections come from irrigation sytems since water can accumulate by the sprinkler heads. If there is a loss in water pressure, water could be sucked back through the pipes bringing any chemical fertilizer, pesticides, animal waste or other bacteria and parasites that were on the ground, back into your plumbing system.

Don't forget to submit the test results to the village's consultant, BSI, it's required by the state.

SEASONAL REMINDERS

Waste Management At Your Door Service

Introduced in Shorewood in 2016, Waste Management offers a way to dispose of home-generated special materials and the ability to schedule a collection at your home - safely, easily, and responsibly. These items may include paints, household cleaners, compact fluorescent lamps (CFL), automotive products, garden chemicals, batteries, electronics, and more. This service is available to Shorewood residents at no additional cost, it is included in your monthly refuse payment.

How does this service work?

- 1. Residents contact this service to schedule a pickup of their items.
- 2. A Collection Kit with instructions will be mailed to your home.
- 3. Read the instructions carefully, there are some items unable to be collected.
- 4. On the day of your collection, place the Collection Bag near your front door or garage area. Then the materials will be picked up at your home.

Additional Information

Bulk Items: One (1) bulk item will be collected with the weekly pick-up (i.e., couch, small tables, mattress, chair, etc.). Carpet is considered a bulk item and must be cut and rolled into 4-foot lengths. Each roll must not weigh more than 50 lbs. All carpeting and padding must be secured with tape or string. Up to eight (8) rolls of carpeting and padding will be accepted each week.

Stopping Water Theft Can Help Keep Rates Low

Most people don't realize that there is a cost associated with producing and delivering water. When water is stolen, that cost must be spread out across those customers who are paying, increasing their bills. When businesses or contractors access water without autorization, they typically open a fire hydrant. This could damage the hydrant and even cause a main break if not operated correctly.

Opening a fire hydrant without proper authorization and equipment (meter and backflow device) is illegal. If you suspect that someone is stealing water, you may report this to the Village of Shorewood Public Works or our Police Department.

Try to get the following information:

- Street name and closest address (of suspected violation)
- Name and phone number of the business (if visible on the vehicle)
- License Plate Number

MAINTAIN YOUR LAWN TO PROTECT RIVERS & STREAMS

Many people like the look of a neatly mowed, bright green lawn. Plus, many communities and Home Owners Associations require residents to maintain their lawns to a certain standard. Traditional lawn maintenance depends on regular mowing, watering and chemical applications—most notably, fertilizers.

Lawn fertilizer contains nutrients, such as nitrogen and phosphorous, that encourage turfgrass to grow quickly. However, the fertilizer we put on our lawns also affects the health of our local rivers and streams.

WHAT LAWN FERTILIZER DOES TO THE WATER

When it rains, excess fertilizer on your lawn and sidewalk is picked up by stormwater and carried down storm drains that lead directly to local rivers and streams.

The amount of nutrients introduced to a stream from lawn fertilizers and other sources is much more than a stream can naturally manage. Many stretches of local waterways are stressed by several factors—such as other pollutants, dams that interrupt a stream's natural flow, in-stream habitat degradation and stream bank erosion. Excess fertilizer further throws off the stream ecosystem.

The same nutrients in fertilizers that encourage grass to grow cause algae in bodies of water to grow too. Spikes in algae harm water quality and suck oxygen from the water that fish and other aquatic life need to survive. These "algae blooms" also detract from the natural beauty of our local streams and impact recreational opportunities like fishing and kayaking.

You may have heard about the "dead zone" in the Gulf of Mexico. Dead zones are areas in a body of water with oxygen levels so low that they cannot sustain life. Did you know that fertilizers used on Midwest agricultural fields are a major cause of the Gulf of Mexico dead zone? The fertilizers on farm fields

• kill fish

run off into local waterways that feed into the Mississippi river and accumulate in the Gulf of Mexico. These fertilizers provide a feast for algae that eventually die off, deplete oxygen and kill fish.

While lawn fertilizers are not used to the same degree as agricultural inputs, we should keep in mind that the fertilizers we use locally have an impact on local streams as well as downstream waters.

FERTILIZER BEST PRACTICES

If you're using fertilizer on your lawn, there are a few things you can keep in mind to lessen the burden on rivers and streams.

Follow Product Instructions

Be sure to read the instructions on the fertilizer package and apply the right amount of product to your grass at the right time. More fertilizer does not make the product work better. In addition to hurting water quality in our rivers and streams, excess fertilizer can cause "fertilizer burn" and damage your grass.

Organic Fertilizer is Still Fertilizer

Synthetic fertilizers are manufactured while organic fertilizers are made from natural sources. Organic or not, treat all fertilizer products carefully. Organic fertilizer still contains nitrogen and phosphorus that affect the health of our waterways and should be used according to the instructions.

Sweep Excess Fertilizer Off Hard Surfaces

Fertilizer that falls on hard surfaces, such as driveways, sidewalks and curbs, are swiftly picked up by stormwater runoff and brought into nearby streams. Sweep excess fertilizer off hard surfaces to protect waterways.

MAINTAIN YOUR LAWN CONT'D

TAKE CARE OF YOUR YARD NATURALLY

Lawn care doesn't have to involve the use of chemicals. Consider these tips for a healthy lawn and to limit your impact on local rivers and streams:

- **Choose a grass better suited to our area.** If you're seeding new grass, select a hardier grass that requires less watering and fertilizer.
- **Don't mow too low.** Mowing a lawn too short exposes surface roots and dries out the soil faster. As a general rule, try not to mow more than 1/3 of the height of the grass at a time.
- Focus on improving the health of your grass and soil over time instead of using large amounts of fertilizer as a quick fix.
- Use a mulching mower to help naturally fertilize lawns. Mulching mowers leave behind shredded grass clippings that act as compost to fertilize your lawn without adding chemicals.
- **Dispose of lawn clippings and other yard waste properly.** Do not dump anything along streams, wetlands, or in other natural areas.
- Consider native plant landscaping. This will reduce the amount of lawn on your property, requiring less fertilizer, watering and mowing. As another benefit to nearby streams, native plants filter out pollutants in runoff and infiltrate the water into the soil. Native plants also improve the local ecosystem by providing habitat for birds and butterflies.



• **Have tolerance.** "Weeds" like clover are actually good for your lawn as they help to fix nitrogen in the soil making it available for you grass to easily use. The clover flowers also provide food for native pollinators.

With this information in mind, you can maintain your lawn in a healthy way that protects the water quality of local rivers and streams!

Garden Guidelines

- Plots are 10'x10' and are limited to 10 per household.
- Village of Shorewood and Troy Township residents can reserve a garden plot for \$25 and \$15 for each additional plot.

Growing Season

May 1 - November 1

All landscape waste, stakes, and fencing must be removed by November 1.

Priority Garden Plot Registration opened January 1st for Returning Gardeners.

Open Registration begins March 12th for any remaining plots. *Availability will be limited*


