CREATING UNIQUE DESTINATIONS FOR RESIDENTS AND VISITORS

Develop a series of publicly accessible spaces that offer attractions not found locally serving as rich amenities to the citizens of Shorewood and destinations for regional tourism and commerce.



PROVIDING ACCESSIBLE CONNECTIONS TO THE COMMUNITY

Provide safe, organized, and continuous circulation access for pedestrian, bicycle, and non-motorized boats as well as their interaction with vehicular traffic along the entire river corridor.



DEVELOPING A DISTINCT IDENTITY THAT IS ONLY SHOREWOOD

Utilize bridges, intersections, and destination entries to create a recognizable social brand for the river and transportation corridors through beautification measures.



ESTABLISHING AN ECONOMICALLY VIABLE FRAMEWORK FOR SUSTAINABILITY

Develop a plan for utilizing funding vehicles and special finance mechanisms to promote a balance of charged public / private reinvestment in the river and transportation corridors.
